
From the Chief Executive Officer of IEnova

Through Fundación IEnova's work, we strive to strengthen and maximize the positive impact of our activities in the communities where we operate.

At Fundación IEnova we are committed to transforming lives by supporting organizations and programs that contribute to the development of the communities to which we belong.




During 2018 Fundación IEnova prioritized projects related to the following programs:

Integral care for children with cancer.



Methodology for Granting Donations

Fundación IEnova supports non-profit organizations approved by the Mexican tax authority (SAT) whose activities are aligned with one of the priority programs and/or with the corporate purpose described in the Foundation's bylaws.

Fundación IEnova employs a robust assessment methodology in order to structure the way in which it determines which projects and organizations to sponsor.

This provides the donation process with transparency and maximizes the impact of the allocated resources.



Applying the Methodology

Each application is thoroughly reviewed in terms of both the entity and the project. By employing this methodology, we can assess the soundness of an organization by reviewing factors such as corporate governance, transparency, experience, recognitions, and sustainability. We also analyze the project, location, performance indicators, potential results and impacts, as well as sustainability-related plans, among other aspects.

The organizations that receive the best evaluations are considered preselected to receive a donation.

Fundación IEnova's management team presents the preselected projects to the Managing Board for approval. Subsequently, the projects approved by the Managing Board are presented to the Advisory Committee, which meets to evaluate them and, if applicable, approve them. The Advisory Committee also analyzes the results and management of Fundación IEnova.

Prior to delivering the resources, we carry out an anti-corruption process in accordance to the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA), the Corporate Ethics Policy, and the IEnova Anti-corruption Procedure for the Approval of Donations, Sponsorships, Improvements, and Memberships, implemented by the Corporate Ethics division.

Once authorized, we sign a collaboration agreement with the selected organizations establishing the conditions that need to be met in order for a donation to be granted.

During the year of operation of the grant, or until the economic resources are spent, the organization must submit quarterly reports as well as the supporting documentation needed to verify compliance with the timetable and conditions established by Fundación IEnova.



Allocation of Projects and Donations by State








"In 2018, in line with Fundación IEnova's education goals we made a donation for \$5.6 M pesos to an energy and technology museum, Museo Nacional de Energía y Tecnología, Trust number F/744942 (FIMUNET,) in Mexico City in order to promote awareness in science and technology focusing on energy. It is worth mentioning that this is a one-time donation to be made exclusively in 2018."

• Beneficiaries include 37 scholarships:

- · 36 at the university level, of which 6 are for studying a semester abroad
- · 1 at the High School level, to study abroad

• CETYS Mobile Renewable Energy Lab

We continued working on activities related to the mobile wind and solar energy lab, with the participation of CETYS students. The lab was installed at educational and technical expos and fairs, and in elementary, middle and high schools near Ensenada, Baja California. It was also installed at the annual meeting of the Jacume communal land, or ejido.

- We moved on to the third phase of the Centro Cultural,
 Deportivo y de las Artes Riberas (CCDA) efforts,
 supplying furnishings and equipment for cultural projects, and installing 85 solar panels.
- We made a contribution to the rehabilitation process for the national energy and technology museum,
 Museo Nacional de Energía y Tecnología, Trust number F/744942 (FIMUNET) to promote awareness of science and technology centered on energy. 1,000,000 visitors are expected.

• A Favor del Niño:

We continued with the second phase of the project to supply electricity generated with clean sources of energy to this entity that offers housing, food, and schooling to children. During this phase, **40 solar panels** were installed, bringing the total up to 87 and supplying 70% of its energy consumption for 2018.

- We built 139 m² and painted 3,602 m² in order to enhance community temples and infrastructure in Yaqui and Mayo indigenous territories.
- We carried out construction or restoration works on 1,845 m² as part of the Triannual Adoption Program for Improvements in Infrastructure at 7 foster homes.
- We refurbished electrical systems at the Casa Hogar del Anciano de Ensenada nursing home (2016-2018).
 We implemented phase II focusing on renovating LED lighting.
- We built the infrastructure needed for supplying natural gas to the Asilo de Niños y Casa Hogar, I.B.P. foster home, generating savings for approximately 44% compared to prior LP gas costs.



Red Cross Winter Plan:

900 packages with basic food supplies distributed at the Sierra Tarahumara.

Medical Services:

\$0.8 M allocated to offering integral care for 150 children with cancer:

 Specialized studies including gammagrams, MRIs, tomography scans, PET scans, ultrasounds, and medications, among others.

Disaster-relief:

- \$200,000 pesos in disaster-relief aid for victims of the Sinaloa floods
- \$569,200 pesos for purchasing furnishings for schools located in highly marginalized regions.

In-kind donations:

- 83 wheelchairs that were put together by employees and delivered to NGOs that offer aid to people living in vulnerable conditions in 10 cities in Mexico.
- Mass donation of backpacks and lunch boxes for 231 children in seven foster homes.

As part of our Collaboration Agreement with the Mexican Red Cross (*Cruz Roja Mexicana, I.A.P.*) for rapid response in case of natural disasters, we made a donation for \$200,000 pesos for victims in the communities affected by floods in the state of Sinaloa in September 2018.

Likewise, through our internal disaster-relief program for victims of the 2017 earthquakes in Mexico City, Puebla, Morelos, Oaxaca, and Chiapas, we donated \$569,200 pesos to Fundación para la Protección de la Niñez, I.A.P. In this effort, funds collected by IEnova employees were matched by Fundación IEnova and used to purchase furnishings for four schools, benefiting 725 students.

Additionally, in collaboration with the Human Capital area, we held team building events during which our employees built 83 wheel chairs that were later donated to Civil Society Organizations that help children and people living in vulnerable conditions in 10 cities in Mexico.

Corporate Volunteers

Our corporate volunteers are an integral part of Fundación IEnova's social commitment events.

In 2018, we held 14 volunteer events through which we benefited the following projects:

IEnova employees donated 231 school supplies packages to children in seven foster homes. In addition, during 2018 Fundación IEnova donated a backpack and lunch box to each of the children.

Fundación IEnova's corporate volunteer events are held twice a year at seven institutions that are part of the Triannual Foster Home Adoption Program for Improvements in Infrastructure.



During 2018, our corporate volunteers program granted more than 450 packages with school supplies, clothes, shoes, and toys to boys and girls living in vulnerable conditions, with the collaboration of approximately 200 volunteers.

WE CONTRIBUTE TO IMPROVING THE LIVES OF CHILDREN LIVING IN FOSTER HOMES:

Triannual Foster Home Adoption Program for Infrastructure Improvements

Participating in the sustainable development of Mexico in a framework of respect and commitment to the communities to which we belong is fundamental to IEnova's business strategy.

We establish a positive relationship with and offer our support to different groups that are part of the

communities to which we belong, all on the basis of our sustainability policy. Through the activities implemented in the **Social Pillar**, we support efforts aimed at improving the quality of life of those who are most in need.

In order to contribute to transforming the lives of children living in vulnerable conditions, at Fundación lEnova we established the **Triannual Foster Home Adoption Program for Infrastructure Improvements** in collaboration with **Fundación para la Protección de la Niñez**.

The goal of this program is to change the living conditions of children who live in foster care. We believe that growing up under healthier and more optimal conditions increases the prospects for these children to have better lives, therefore, the funds we donate are allocated to improving the infrastructure of the foster homes where they live.



As part of this effort, between 2015 and 2017 Fundación IEnova adopted six foster homes located near our operations:

- El Camino Hacia Adelante, A.C., in Chihuahua, Chihuahua
- Promoción y Acción Comunitaria, I.A.P. (Casa PACO), in Mexico City
- Casa Esperanza para Niños, I.A.P., in Hermosillo, Sonora
- Institución Paccelli, A.C., in Mexicali, Baja California
- Casa Hogar Cañón Buenavista, A.C., in Ensenada, Baja California
- Albergue del Padre Manuelito, A.C., in Torreón, Coahuila



The funds are allocated to infrastructure works that vary depending on the needs of each foster home, including:

- Upgrading workshops
- Repairing electric systems
- Repairing and remodeling roofs, bedrooms, play areas, and bathrooms
- Building or repairing computer rooms, multi-purpose rooms, office spaces
- Installing security systems and telephone exchanges









In 2015-2017—the first three-year period of this successful program—we invested 4.8 million pesos, benefiting 309 children.



In 2018 we started the new 2018-2020 foster home adoption program.

During this second phase, we will make donations for improving facilities at seven foster homes:

- Casa Hogar Jeruel, A.C., in Chihuahua, Chihuahua
- Promoción y Acción Comunitaria, I.A.P. (Casa PACO), in Mexico City
- Casa Guadalupe Libre, I.A.P., in Hermosillo, Sonora
- Betesda Mexicali, A.C., in Mexicali, Baja California
- Casa Hogar Manantial de Amor, A.C., in Monterrey, Nuevo León
- Casa Hogar para Niños Rancho El Milagro, I.B.P., in Tecate, Baja California
- Albergue del Padre Manuelito, A.C., in Torreón, Coahuila

The following are among the improvements we plan to make:

- Repairing and remodeling bathrooms and bedrooms
- Building the first phase of an area that will be allocated to offering specialized help to children
- Purchasing furnishings
- Installing solar panels

Additionally, twice a year we hold corporate volunteer events that offer us the opportunity to get to know and spend time with the children we sponsor.

The first event, which takes place before the beginning of the school year, is known as **Escuela + Sonrisas** (School + Smiles). It consists of donating school supplies packages collected by our employees.



At the end of the year we carry out a second event, **Árbol de la Sonrisa** (Smiling Tree), during which we give the children toys, clothes and shoes, all of which are also donated by our employees, thus contributing to making the holidays a happier time for the kids.

This program has enabled our employees to view the project as something that is very close to their hearts given that they establish a strong relationship with the children.



At Fundación IEnova we are proud to support this project and contribute to improving the lives of children and youngsters in our communities. We are certain that with programs such as these, we contribute to changing the lives of groups of people who need it the most.



b) Includes a mass donation of backpacks and lunch boxes for children in foster homes and the donation of wheel chairs to organizations that offer aid to vulnerable groups.


